Annual Property Owners Meeting
Saturday June 24, 2017

President Russ Martin called the meeting to order at 2:15 P.M. A quorum was established, and the proper posting of the Agenda verified. Mr. Martin led the Pledge of Allegiance, and the Invocation was given by Mike Fryer. The minutes from June 25, 2016 annual meeting and the meeting to elect officers from June 25, 2016 were read by Barbara House.

The Auditor's report prepared by Kelly Bryan, was read by Jan Pierce. Mrs. Pierce then gave the Treasurer's report. Jan thanked everyone for helping her with the treasurer's job, and especially Sandra Holzheuser for all her assistance. The Road Committee report was given by Willis LeJeune. He asked people to drive slowly, as we now have many more vehicles than in the past.

Mike Fryer requested that people get together with Stewart Billingsley to sign up for the reverse 911 program. He gave the VFD report mentioning that there was only one fire assist, but several EMT calls. He thanked the volunteer fire fighters and the volunteer support group for putting in over 1,000 volunteer hours. Thanks went to Benny Masters and Julian Pierce for their maintenance of the fire trucks. Because of our status as a Firewise Community we received grants for two fire trucks.

There was no New Business brought up, so the Board went to Open Comments. Jeff Fischer stated that he counted 150 vehicles in one day. He said that there is a problem with speeders, and encouraged the Board to write letters to them. Deb LaGarde reminded us that some people ride on ATVs. Joe Thompson thanked Willis and the volunteers for their work. He wanted to impress on people that they should ride on the right side of the road. He said that in Mexico there is a sign that says "Stay to the right, the life you save may be your own."

Mike reminded people to shop at the VFD sale in the back of the station, and thanked Cindy Davis for handling the donation jar to help with the cost of the meat. Barbara House announced that the items in the fundraiser were now 1/3 off. Jan Pierce stated that our road crew says it is very scary for them when people drive fast around them, because it is hard for them to see the speeders. If they move their equipment, they may clip the speeder's vehicle. Willis talked about speed bumps, but they can slow down or damage emergency vehicles, and he thinks that they are not a good idea. Paul Reed said he was "throwing his hat in the ring" to help with fund raising.

Recess was called at 3:10 P.M. and lasted til 5:P.M., then the voting results were presented by Russ Martin. Cindy Davis voted to adjourn, seconded by Russ Martin, and the meeting adjourned at 5:06 P.M.
